Explore the gardens and Normandy D-Day Installation | © Jules and Bean

You are welcome to do just the house/lunch/garden and exhibition or spend the day with us.

Stowe Gardens is the UK's official host for the British D-Day 80 memorial exhibition 'For Your Tomorrow'.

A memorial installation to soldiers killed in the D Day landing on 6 June 1944 is now on display at Stowe Gardens. We are the UK's official host of the commemoration. The large-scale art installation consists of 1,475 silhouettes of Second World War military personnel. The exhibition is installed in Stowe's Grecian Valley, which is around a 2000m (1.2 mile) walk — the People's Tribute was created by community artist, Dan Barton with the number of figures in the display representing the number of fatalities under British command on 6 June 1944.

Tanya Brittain, General Manager of the National Trust gardens at Stowe says, "It's an honour to be chosen as the official UK host location for the British D-Day 80 memorial exhibition, For Your Tomorrow – the People's Tribute.

"This autumn is an opportunity to remember family, friends and colleagues lost in conflict situations over the past 80 years. Stowe has a rich military history and we look forward to welcoming visitors to experience this poignant outdoor art installation against the stunning backdrop of the Stowe's historic Landscape Gardens.

"The 18th-century landscape garden at Stowe is well known for its many historic buildings and statues and has also featured in many well-known films and TV series. The Capability Brown designed landscape is renowned for its precise placement of eye-catching monuments to create the picture-perfect view. Its beautiful avenues, temples and lakes will provide an impressive outdoor gallery space and backdrop for this celebrated artwork."

The silhouettes are designed to represent the military personnel form all the major services but in addition, two bespoke figures of nurses have been included. They are of Sister Mollie Evershed and Sister Dorothy Field who died while helping to save 75 men from the hospital ship SS Amsterdam which sank off the Normandy beaches on 7th August 1944.

Both were given posthumous commendation for their actions and are the only two women commemorated on the British Normandy Memorial.

Artist Dan Barton has delivered several impactful military-based displays since founding Oxfordshire-based charity Standing with Giants. The life-size figures are constructed entirely by volunteers, using recycled building materials and create meaningful spaces for people to visit and reflect.

"Our ethos at Standing with Giants is to value life, to understand and appreciate why we have our freedom, and to remember and pay tribute to those who have fallen so we can live the lives we have today. Using outdoor art is a great way to do this," said Standing with Giants Founder, Dan Barton.

This costs £3 per person, each way. Tickets available from New Inn Visitor Centre. Departing from the coach park every 30 minutes. First come, first-seated.

SUMMER SOLSTICE CAMPING AT SHELL ISLAND

Shell Island Llanbedr Gwynedd North Wales LL45 2PJ (Click for Map)

How to find us: It is impossible to predicted where on the site we will be setting camp. There are favourite places but other campers may already occupy them.

Shell Island is a remote, stunningly beautiful place, accessed by a tidal causeway. There is just one road, squeezed between Shell and the Rhinog Mountains. There are rolling sand dunes and a harbour, all to be experienced on 2025's longest day. Lying on the Welsh coast between Harlech and Barmouth the facilities are excellent (hot showers, restaurant, pub, shops and laundrette). It is low density and in some areas almost wild. It is possible to camp 15 minutes walk away from the central amenities. As most children are in school, the campsite is quiet and the roads clear. In the evenings we walk, barbecue and discuss what we will be doing the following day. Also, we visit local restaurants. Bring a tent, wine and walking boots. There is not enough space here to list the many attractions, so go to www.visitwales.com and look at both North Wales and Mid Wales.

Saturday, 21st June 2025, is the longest day and the first day of summer. Join Merseyside IVC for seven nights under canvas at Shell Island, from Sunday, 15th June and leaving on Sunday 22nd June 2025. The 2024 price was £10-75 per person per night. Bookings may be made online at the Shell Island website. Stay for just as long as you wish.
